



## 2020 Impact Report

### Mission:

The Frederick A. DeLuca Foundation, Inc. supports charitable programs that empower people to lead healthy and productive lives through education, awareness, and research initiatives.

### 2020 Focus Areas:

In 2020, the Foundation disbursed a total of 148 grants across the following focus areas: Arts Education and Outreach, Healthy Communities, Scholarships, Workforce Development and Youth Development. The table below breaks down the foundation’s projected impact by focus area:
